




Caid College of Heraldry

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Minutes of the February 27, 2011 College of Heraldry Meeting

Meeting commenced at 11:00 AM.

In attendance were: Su *Crescent*, *Illuminada Dolphin*, *Jeanne Marie Noir Licorne*, *Damien Sable Fret*, *Eirikr Gold Phoenix*, *Cormac Seraph*, and *Lachlan Silver Abacus*.

Upcoming meetings are: March 20, April 9 (Roadshow at Collegium), and May 15.

Unless otherwise noted, all submitters will accept the creation of a holding name, if appropriate. Approved submissions will be forwarded on the March 29, 2011 Letter of Intent.

A'isha bint Shamir ~ Resub K. name.

The name and device were returned at the January 2011 meeting by *Crescent* for administrative reasons (lack of funds).

The submitter desires a feminine name. She will not allow major changes or the creation of a holding name. She cares most about the (unspecified) spelling of the name.

'**A'isha** is a feminine name found in Juliana de Luna's "Andalusian Names: Arabs in Spain,"

bint is the patronymic designator for "daughter of".

Shamir is a masculine name found in Juliana de Luna's "Andalusian Names: Arabs in Spain,"

Starkhafn

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

A'isha bint Shamir ~ Resub K device. *Sable, an annulet suspended by three chains in pall throughout Or.*

The name and device were returned at the January 2011 meeting by *Crescent* for administrative reasons (lack of funds).

We believe this device is clear of the device *Sable, a pall of chain Or between three bezants* (Aleksandr Yaroslavovich Vyetcikov, Oct. 1990) with a CD for removing the bezants and at least a CD between the pall of chains and an annulet suspended by chains. We believe this is also clear of the device *Per pale argent ermined purple and purple, an annulet Or* (Vladimir Vitalievich Volkov, 04/97) with a CD for changes to the field and a CD for adding the chains.

Starkhafn

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Cecilia Medici ~ *Purple, a domestic cat rampant maintained an axe, on a chief Or an arrow reversed vert.*

Name was registered 10/08.

Conflict with the device *Purple, a lion rampant and on a chief Or three crosses formy gules* (Friedrich von Augsburg, 08/ 01), with a single CD for the changes to the tertiary charges.

Altavia

Device returned for conflict. (Damien will consult with the submitter.)

Colette Olivier le Fournier ~ Resub K New Name.

The submitter will accept all changes and indicates no preferences. Submitted as Colette le Fournier, the submitter was unable to attend the meeting due to snow and requested via e-mail that Olivier be added to clear the previous conflict.

Colette is found as a feminine given name in "French Names from Paris, 1421, 1423, & 1438" by Aryanhwych merch Catmael at <http://heraldry.sca.org/names/french/paris1423.html> which cites 3 instances.

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Olivier is found as a masculine given name in "French Names from Paris, 1421, 1423, & 1438" by Aryanhwy merch Catmael at <http://heraldry.sca.org/names/french/paris1423.html> which cites 5 instances. Unmarked patronymics are unremarkable in French names.

Fournier is found as a surname meaning "person of the oven" (a play on the submitter's profession) in "French Names from Paris, 1421, 1423, & 1438" by Aryanhwy merch Catmael at <http://heraldry.sca.org/names/french/paris1423.html> which cites 5 instances.

Previous submission Colette de Fournier was returned by *Crescent* Jan 2011 for aural and visual conflict with Colecte La Fourniere (11/08).

Wintermist

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Colette Olivier le Fournier ~ Resub K New Device. *Or, a chevron between two ravens, heads to center, displayed and a fox rampant guardant sable.*

The identical emblazon was returned for lack of a name at the January 2011 meeting.

The use of ravens displayed is a step from period practice.

This is clear of the device *Or, a chevron between three birds close sable* (Freydís in tryggva Sigurðardóttir, 02/ 01), with a CD for changing the type of half the secondary charges and the posture of the other half.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Garret Thornwood ~ New Name

The submitter desires a masculine name, cares most about language/culture Tudor London mid 1500, and will accept all changes.

Submitted as GARRET THORNWOOD, the name has been changed to match standard capitalization.

Garret is found in Withycombe (s.n. Gerard, p. 131), "*Garret* is given as a christian name by Camden 1605 and Lyford 1655." The same entry dates Garrett to 16th C Royal Accounts.

Thornwood is found at familysearch.org (see attached screen shot) from an extraction project, with Elizabeth Thornwood christened in 1605.

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Garret Thornwood ~ New Device. *Sable, two chevronels inverted and in chief three Latin crosses fleury Or.*

Conflict with the device *Gules, two chevronels inverted, in chief three Latin crosses fleury Or* (Jonathan de Saint-Clair, 10/06), with a single CD for the tincture of the field.

Device returned for conflict.

Iseabail inghean Bhaltair. New name.

[Name] Submitter allows changes, cares most about the sound, and states "I would like to be Iseabail daughter of Walter."

Iseabail - "Iseabail MacDuff was the Countess of Buchan -- she was born in Scotland in 1286, and was also known as Iseabail Inghean Dhonnchai. I would like to be Iseabail daughter of Walter."

Iseabail is found as the modern spelling of Yssbell ne v'kellan on p 118-9 of "The Dean of Lismore's book : a selection of ancient Gaelic poetry from a manuscript collection made by Sir James M'Gregor, Dean of Lismore, in the beginning of the sixteenth century" listed in the contents as Isabella Ni vic Caillein found at

<http://www.archive.org/stream/deanoflismoresbo00macluoft#page/118/mode/2up/search/119> shows the ancient version and the 'modern' version. Iseabail appears to be a modern form of the name. It has been ruled unregistrable as recently as Dec. 2009 (v. Isibél of Dunbegane).

Bhaltair is found in Black with the following spelling variants of Walter: p. 800 s.n. Walter, "Wealdhere in AF, became Wautier, which when spelled Walter at a later period was long pronounce Water, and so gave name to Wat, Watt and Wattie. Patrick Walter was a tenant under Douglas in the barony of Buittle, 1376. Valter 1490." On page 570 s.n. MacWalter, Macqualter. G. MacBhaltair, 'son of Walter,' q.v. John Makwatter and Ewin McWalter, followers of the earl of Cassilis, were respited for murder in 1526. John Graham McWalter in Duchry was fined for reset of outlawed Macgregors, 1613. ... An old form of the name in Galloway was Macquhalter.

Altavia

Name returned for lack of documentation.

Iseabail inghean Bhaltair. New name and device. *Sable, a lion rampant queue-forchy rampant maintaining in its dexter forepaw a strung bow and in its sinister forepaw a sheaf of arrows, on a chief gules three bezants.*

There was discussion on whether the primary charge was a lion or a wolf. The submitter is advised to make it clearly one or the other on resubmission.

Device returned for lack of contrast.

Johannes de Groote ~ New Name

The submitter desires a masculine name. He cares about the (unspecified) sound and will not accepted major changes.

Johannes is found as a Dutch masculine given name dated 1432-33, 1478, 1481-1488 in "15th Century Dutch Names" by Aryanhwy merch Catmael at <http://heraldry.sca.org/names/dutch/dutch15.html>.

de Groote is found as a 15th century Dutch locative byname. Both De Groote, cited to 1471, and de Groote, cited from 1454 to 1550, are found at "Flemish Bynames from Bruges, 1400-1600: D-K" at <http://www.s-gabriel.org/docs/bruges/byname-list2.html> which lists all the bynames found in Histoire de la Gilde des Archers de Saint Sebastien de la Ville de Bruges by Henri Godar, Bruges, 1947.

Based on "Given Names from Brittany, 1384-1600" by Tangwystl at

<http://heraldry.sca.org/laurel/names/latebreton.html>, Jan is a variation of Johannes therefore this conflicts with Jan DeGroot (08/83).

Isles

Name returned for conflict.

Serenity of the Isles ~ Resub K New Device *Per chevron argent and azure, two domestic cats combattant and Joan of Arc statant affronty counterchanged.*

Device was returned by Crescent Jan 2011 for redraw.

The chevron needs to be drawn with the point of the per chevron higher on the field and with an angle less than 90°. The feet are in trian aspect and the figure is neither affront or to dexter. The central figure should be facing fully forward or fully sideways though its feet could be in a "V" formation. The cats should be drawn larger as befits primary charges. Several suggestions were made since the submitter specifically wants Joan of Arc: less detail on the armor would allow for the figure to be more clearly female, changing or removing the sword might also facilitate the identification of the figure as feminine, and more detail on the face and hair might help with identifying the figure as female. The submitter is also advised to clarify what makes the figure Joan of Arc, as opposed to an armored female human.

Due to the multiple artistic problems, a complete conflict check was not done

The period depictions we found of Joan of Arc (Jeanne d'Arc) show her in armor, without a helmet, carrying a swallow-tailed flag, a sword, or a cross – primarily the swallowed-tail flag– and without a helmet. We consider the flag to be part of the defining features of Joan of Arc. Period depictions of Joan of Arc are attached.
