Approved submissions were forwarded to Laurel on the November 30, 2015 Letter of Intent.

November Submissions

Arabella Attelake (Calafia) – Kingdom Resub Device. *Per fess wavy argent and purpure, two otters passant each maintaining in its mouth a fish counterchanged.*

The submitter's device of the same blazon was returned by the Caid College of Heralds at their October 2015 meeting for lack of identifiability of the fish. Per the August 2015 LoAR: "a charge, held or conjoined, which is clearly not a co-primary charge is equivalent to the former definition of sustained if it is identifiable, no matter what its size." Therefore, this is not in conflict with Rionach O'Melaghlin: *Per fess wavy argent and purpure, a harp and an otter statant counterchanged*. (October 1989 via the West), as Rionach's otter does not have a fish, giving us one DC for the change of type of half the primary charge group and a second DC for the addition of the fish.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Arabella O'Hurlihie – New Name & New Device *Per bend vert and Or, two crescents their horns outward, between the horns of each crescent a heart, points to center counterchanged.*

The submitter has no preferences as to gender and marks no other preferences.

Arabella is found in England in family search

Arabella Fysher; Female; Christening; 24 Oct 1575; Toddington, Bedford, England; Batch: P00391-1 Arabella Petts; Female; Christening; 27 Jul 1557; Eastwick, Hertford, England; Batch: K07232-2

O Hurlihie is found in 16th & 17th Century Anglicized Irish Surnames from Woulfe by Mari ingen Briain meic Donnchada

(http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/Woulfe/SortedByAnglicizedRoot.shtml as the Anglicized form of the Gaelic Ó hIarf.lat.a, Ó hIarlat.a, Ó hIarlat.a, Ó hIarlatha.

In Anglicized Irish, either *O* or *O'* may be used as a patronymic marker. (See http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/AnglicizedIrish/)

As submitted, the hearts were too small to be identified. They were redrawn with the submitter's approval.

Bríg ingen Uatéir- New Device. *Per bend sinister vert and sable, a bend sinister between an arrow and a dagger inverted, both bendwise sinister, argent*

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Diederik Guiscard - New Name & New Device

Quarterly Or and vert, on a fess sable three bezants and in chief two lions passant respectant counterchanged

Submitter desires a masculine name. Sound (Unspecified) most important.

Diederik appears to be an 11th century Dutch name. It was the Dutch birth name of the 15th Count of Flanders (*Diederik van den Elzas*) and the

Aimon Guiscard was registered in 05-2010 (http://heraldry.sca.org/loar/2010/05/10-05lar.html In commentary on that submission Alys *Elmet* noted: "I succeeded in finding on line Gaufredo Malaterra's 11th century chronicle "De rebus gestis Rogerii Calabriae et Siciliae comitis et Roberti Guiscardi Ducis fratris eius" (http://www.intratext.com/IXT/LAT0870/). <Guiscard> seems to be a reasonable vernacular form."

Device Comments: It was felt by the college that the fess was too large and made it difficult to determine if it was a fess, or if there was a chief. The device was redrawn at the meeting with the submitter's approval.

Name approved and forwarded. Device approved and forwarded.

Dun Or, Barony of -New Badge *Or, a poppy gules slipped and leaved vert within a bordure azure.* This submission is to be associated with *Crimson Poppy, Order of the*

This conflicts with Dorathea Osborne: *Or, a gillyflower gules slipped and leaved vert, a bordure azure* (via Caid, December 1998). There only DC for type of flower.

Badge returned for conflict.

D'vorah bint Da'ud -New Device Change. Azure, a bee Or.

Old Item: *Purpure, in chief three bees Or marked purpure and on a point pointed Or, a bee purpure marked Or,* to be retained as a badge.

Submitter indicates that she has obtained written and signed permission to conflict from Elizabeth Braidwood (*Fieldless*) *A bee Or*, but has misplaced the document. However, there are multiple other conflicts including: Þórormr Snorrason (DEVICE, Aug 2008, Middle), *Azure, a bee and in chief three drinking horns Or* and Rhydderich Hael, Barony of the (badge, May 2004, Æthelmearc), *Per pale vert and sable, a bee Or*.

Device returned for conflict.

Eustace of Naevehjem -New Name

Submitter indicates no preferences.

Eustace is a masculine English given name found in Withycombe as a header spelling and dated 1273. **Naevehjem** is SCA branch name registered August 1987 via Caid.

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Gemma Rosalia - New Device Change. *Purpure, in bend three crescents bendwise sinister between two bendlets and in bend sinister two ferrets statant argent.*

Old Item: *Purpure, three increscents in bend between two ferrets statant argent*, to be retained as a badge.

This device uses an arrangement of three charge groups on the field that is not found in SENA Appendix J.

Device change returned for undocumented arrangement of charges.

Harding Fayrehale of Lyondemere - New Name & New Device. *Gules, a chief engrailed lozengy sable and argent.*

Harding is an English given name found in the Domesday Book.

Fayrehale is an English surname found in R&W s.n. Fairhall, with *Thomas atte Fayrehale* dated to 1332.

Lyondemere is an SCA branch name, registered Jan. 1980.

The college was divided about whether the complex edge of the chief was identifiable when combined with the lozengy pattern, therefore this is forwarded for Wreath to decide.

Jarijch van Den Helder - New Name

Submitted on the form as Jirrik (Dirick) van Den Helder. The submitter indicated to *Dolphin* that would prefer Jarijch.

Jarijch is a Dutch given name found in FamilySearch Historical Records:

Den Helder is a Dutch placename. We ask the assistance of the College in documenting it to period.

Jarijch van Den Helder -New Household Name. Beggars' Inn.

Originally submitted as The Beggar's Inn. Although the submitter allows no changes, he was contacted by Dolphin and agreed to Beggars' Inn, the name the college was able to document.

Noir Licorne found Proverbial Language in English Drama Exclusive of Shakespeare, 1495-1616: An Index, Volume 2 (Robert William Dent, U. of California, 1984) includes a reference to Beggars' Inn c. 1605 (image 1).

In case evidence can be found for <surname> Inn, Ambre notes

Beggar is a late period surname in Scotland which could document House of Beggar. None of the Inn names seem to use a surname that I can find.

Klaus Mühlhauser von Unterwessen. New Alternate Name. *Óláfr inn klaufi Haraldsson* Culture (Norse) most important.

Meaning (Olaf the clumsy son of Harald) most important.

Originally submitted on the iLOI as a name change with the original name being kept as an alternate, this was a mistake, as confirmed with the submitter. Óláfr is the desired alternate name.

Óláfr - Geirr Bassi, lists Óláfr as a male given name p .13

klaufi is found in GB p. 24 and means clumsy. As a weak adjective, it can also be written with the article "inn" per GB. 19.

GB pp. 11 s.n. Haraldr, -r becomes -s.

Thus we believe the name construction is correct.

Kyra Audax - New Name & New Device

Vert, a serpent ondoyant between three eyes argent, irised azure

Cyra is documented as a feminine given name in 1647 https://books.google.com/books?id=GnpjAAAAcAAJ&pg=PA520 image below.

The registration of William Korwynson of Starfall (June 2015, West) notes the initial C/K switch is common in English.

Audax is a Dutch surname found in 1648. https://books.google.com/books? id=7ThDAAAAAAAJ&pg=RA1-PA104

English and Dutch are combinable.

Name approved and forwarded. Device approved and forward.

Lyondemere, Barony of. New Badge. *Argent, two pillars vert issuant from a base engrailed azure*. The badge To be associated with the Order of the Pillars of Poseidon.

Badge approved and forwarded.

Nero Livius Primus - Kingdom Resub Device. *Sable, a cobra erect Or winged and on a base argent a mullet of four points gules.*

The submitter's device of the same blazon was returned by the Caid College of Heralds at their October 2015 meeting for redraw, as the wings were too small. This redraw addresses the reason for return.

The artist is advised to draw the mullet more mullet-y.

Sable, a chevron inverted argent goutty de sang
