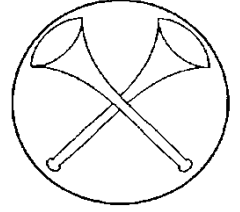

Minutes of the October 16, 2016 Meeting

Meeting commenced at 11:36 AM.

In attendance were: Paul *Crescent*, Jeanne Marie *Blue Mountain*, Ariana *Trident*, Ardgal *Silver Mace*, Ariana *Seraph-Elect*, Manus *Battlement*, Eridana *Ambre*, Angharat *Garb*, Illuminada *Chanson*, Bruce *Batonvert*, and Cormac *Beare*.

Meeting schedule for 2016: Nov 13th, Dec 4th.

Approved submissions were forwarded to Laurel on the October 31, 2016 Letter of Intent.

From Crescent:

- Congratulations to Ardgal *Silver Mace*, who was elevated to the Order of the Dolphin at Great Western War's grand court.

October Submissions

Aóisla Frilla (Darach) – Laurel Resub Device. *Azure, on a pale sable fimbriated between two needles a drop spindle argent.*

The submitter's previous device, *Quarterly azure and sable, two needles in saltire surmounted by a drop-spindle argent*, was returned by Laurel on the January 2015 LoAR for conflict.

Originally submitted as *Tierced per pale azure, sable, and azure, a drop spindle between two needles argent*. Blazon was corrected, and fimbriation added per approval of the submitter to clear contrast issues.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Aóisla Frilla (Darach) – Laurel Resub Badge (*Fieldless*) *Five sinister cubit arms couped, gripping in annulo, gules.*

Her previous badge, (*Fieldless*) *Two needles in saltire surmounted by a drop-spindle argent*, was returned by Laurel on the January 2015 LoAR for conflict.

There is a step from period practice for charges arranged in annulo, rather than in their default arrangement.

Badge approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Alice le Sage (Carreg Wen) - New Device. *Azure, on a chevron inverted argent, two oak leaves stems to center vert.*

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Althea of Caid (Wintermist) - New Name & New Device. *Argent, a magpie striking contourny sable marked argent, on a chief sable an arrow reversed argent.*

Submitter indicates no preferences.

Althea is an English feminine given name found in FamilySearch Historical Records:

Althea Hughes married William Payne, Nov. 1648, London, England, batch M15108-1 (<https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:NVLT-N8F>).

Caid is a branch of the SCA, registered in 1973

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Amabel Radleigh (Altavia) - New Device. *Argent, three columbines azure, slipped and leaved vert.*

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Ambrose Mallory (Calafia) - New Name.

Ambrose is Scottish masculine given name found in FamilySearch Historical Records, including:

- Ambrose Russell, married 15 Jan 1583; Fife, Scotland; Batch M11403-2 (<https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:XTGY-WYG>)
- Ambrose Bryce, married 14 Jan 1590; Stirling, Scotland; Batch M11490-2 (<https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:XYWL-98C>)

Mallory is as English surname found in Reaney and Wilson, page 295, as a header spelling, Robert Mallory, dated to 1255.

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Amira bint Zakariya' (Calafia) - New Device & New Name. *Per pale embowed counter-embowed argent and Or, in pale a rose fesswise proper slipped and leaved vert and a dragon sable.*

Amira is a feminine Arabic *ism* (given name) found in "Period Arabic Names and Naming Practices" by Da'ud ibn Auda (<http://heraldry.sca.org/names/arabic-naming2.htm>). Amira means princess and in

an alternative title in the SCA so cannot be used with a locative byname (which is not the case here) (Amira de Kent, Lochac, June 2015)

bint Zakariya' is a feminine Arabic *nisab* meaning "is an Arabic term meaning "daughter of Zakariya"" *Zakariya'* is a masculine Arabic *ism* found in the same article.

The pattern of "<ism> bint <father's ism>" is found in the same article.

There were some questions about whether this ran afoul of unity of orientation issues. It was noted that as the slips and leaves of a rose do not count for difference, it should likewise not count for whatever orientation issues might arise.

We feel that the line of division is recognizable, that the sizes of the charges are sufficient to be co-primary, and that the dragon does not cross the fess line sufficiently to make it the sole primary.

Andrew Baird (Dun Or) - New Badge. (*Fieldless*) *A chi-rho within and conjoined to a mascle Or.*

Badge approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Ash Blackthorn (Dreiburgen) - New Name & New Device. *Azure, a gauntlet maintaining a pilgrim's staff fesswise argent and in chief three grenades Or enflamed proper.*

Submitter desires a masculine name.

Ash is a masculine English given name found in FamilySearch Historical Records:

Ash Tatnell, married 1622, Middlesex, England, batch M01721-8,

Blackthorn is as an English surname found in the same source:

John Blackthorn, married 1581, London, England, batch M04160-8,

Name returned for lack of form.

Device returned for lack of form.

Briana MacCabe (Altavia) - New Badge. (*Fieldless*) *A candle bendy Or and purple lit gules.*

Badge approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Dubheasa MacLeod (Dreiburgen) - New Name.

Submitter desires a feminine name and allows no major changes.

Sound (du-besa) most important.

Dubheasa is a proposed interpolated spelling of a name that is found in "Index of Names in Early Irish Annals" by Mari Elspeth nic Bryan, with these spellings dated to 1328: *Duibhesa*, *Duibheasa*, *Dubhesa*.

MacLeod is a Scottish surname found in Black, dated in this spelling for Gillandres MacLeod to 1227.

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Eadric the Younger (Altavia) – Laurel Resub Device. *Per chevron vert and azure, on a chevron argent three stone mills palewise sable.*

Submitter's previous device, with same blazon, was returned by Laurel for redraw on the May 2016 LOAR:

This device is returned for a redraw, for violating the guidelines set forth on the May 2011 Cover Letter for a properly drawn chevron. The chevron here is too high. Please see that Cover Letter for further discussion and details of how to properly draw per chevron lines of division.

The redraw addresses the cause of the return; the per chevron line of division was placed at 90 degrees with the midpoint of each arm located on the fess line, then shifted equally up and down.

Badge approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Edith Daffe (Nordwache) - New Name & New Device. *Per chevron inverted gules and argent, a phoenix Or and three acorns proper leaved vert.*

Edith is a feminine English given name found in Withycombe, 3rd. edition, page 93, which states: "Edith remained common all through the Middle Ages and never died out entirely, though it was infrequent from 16th to 18th C." It also appears in "Feminine Given Names in *A Dictionary of English Surnames*," by Talan Gwynek, <http://heraldry.sca.org/names/reaneyAG.html>, dated 1207.

Daffe is a surname found in Reaney and Wilson 3rd edition, *Lefeke Daffe*, dated to 1279.

The device was redrawn with the submitter's permission to use a registerable *per chevron inverted* division.

Edmund Barlow (Lyondemere) - New Name & New Device. *Gules, a stag rampant argent attired Or and on a chief argent three roses proper.*

Submitter desires a masculine name.

No major changes.

Sound most important.

Edmund is found in “English Given Names from 16th and Early 17th C Marriage Records: Edmund” by Aryanhwy merch Catmael: “Edmund - 1551* DSO; 1556 DSO; 1562 HUR; 1563 HUR; 1584 HEX; 1591 EAS; 1596 RED; 1597 EAS; 1598 HEX; 1602 RYT; 1607 WHK; 1608 RYT; 1609 HAM

Barlow is an English surname found in FamilySearch Historical Records, including:

John Barlow, christened 23 July 1585, Stafford, England; Batch C13560-6

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Eduard Schade der Altere (Dreiburgen) – Laurel Resub Device. *Azure, a bend sinister sable fimbriated between a cloud argent and a flame Or.*

The submitter’s devise of the same blazon was returned by Laurel on the July 2016 LoAR, stating:

This device is returned for violating SENA A2C1 which states that "Elements must be drawn in their period forms". Here, the cloud is not drawn in a period heraldic form, which precedent states is grounds for return.

This redraw addresses the reason for return.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Edward Senestre (Dreiburgen) - New Badge. *(Fieldless) A boar’s head caboshed per pale vert and purpura, armed argent.*

Noted as being associated with “Tusk and Talon.” The household name is not registered, and so the badge cannot be associated with it.

After the meeting, the submitter contacted Paul *Crescent* and asked that the badge be withdrawn to be redesigned.

Badge withdrawn by submitter.

Einrik von Houwinstein (Nordwache) – Laurel Resub Device Change. *Argent, a bear statant erect affronty sable, on a base azure a Roman helmet affronty Or.*

Old Item: *Azure, a crescent and on a chief argent two bear's heads erased sable*, to be retained as a badge.

His prior submission, *Argent, a bear statant erect affronty sable between flaunches azure* was returned by Laurel in Aug. 2015 for conflict. This redesign clears that conflict.

A couple of issues were brought up in commentary: The crest of the helm touches the top of the base, one of the bear's toenails overhangs the base, and the bear's posture appears to be trian aspect. With the submitter's permission, the device was redrawn to address these issues, as well as to correct the color of the base from *gules* to *azure*.

Elle Mallory (Calafia) - New Name.

Submitter accepts all changes and indicates no preferences.

Elle is a feminine English given name found in FamilySearch Historical Records:

Mallory is found as English surname in the same source:

Eoghan Ó Gabhann & Clota ni Ghabhann (Nordwache) - New Badge. *(Fieldless) A thistle proper within and issuant from a massacre azure*

The names that appear on the form are the submitters' registered alternate names.

Badge approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Eoghan Ó Gabhann (Nordwache) - New Badge. *Per chevron sable and argent, three roundels counterchanged*

The original submission's *per chevron* line of division was a bit high. Per approval of the submitter, the artwork was redrawn.

Badge approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Euphilia Ramsbottom (Angels) - New Device. *Argent, a musimon's head cabossed sable.*

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Faizah al-Zarqa (Dun Or) - New Badge. *(Fieldless) Three peacock feathers purpure enfiling a ducal coronet Or*

Recipient was created a Duchess on 6/7/2008 by TRM Edward and Mora

Badge approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Francisco Rodrigo de Gomez y Sandoval (Altavia) - New Name & New Device. *Or, a bend engouled of two boars' heads sable between two fleurs-de-lys azure.*

Submitter desires a masculine name.

No major changes.

Client requests authenticity for Spanish.

Language (Spanish) most important.

Culture (Spanish) most important.

Francisco is a male Spanish given name found in "16th Century Spanish Names" by Elsbeth Anne Roth (<http://heraldry.sca.org/names/spanish/index.html>).

Rodrigo is found as a masculine given name 11 times in the same article.

Gomez is found as patronymic in the same article.

Sandoval is found as a Spanish surname in FamilySearch Historical Records with Beatris Camara Sandoval chr. 1564 in Yucatan Mexico, batch C64300-1 (<https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:NPDX-4HT>).

SENA Appendix A notes that double given names are found in late period Spanish.

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Furia Tertia (Calafia) - New Name Change.

Old Item: Tik-Astrid Olafsdottir, to be retained as an alternate name.

No major changes.

Furia is a feminization of *Furius*, a male Roman nomen.

Tertia is a feminization of *Tertius*, a male Roman cognomen.

Both male names were found in "A Simple Guide to Imperial Roman Names" by Ursula Georges, at <http://heraldry.sca.org/names/roman.html>.

Name change approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Halla Jónsdóttir (Calafia) – **New Name Change and New Device Change.** *Per pale azure and gules, on a chevron rompu inverted argent three roses sable.*

Submitter desires a feminine name.

No major changes.

Old item, Caitilin Macallister, to be released.

Old Item: Per pale gules and azure, on a chevron rompu argent three roses sable barbed and seeded proper., to be released.

Halla is a female Norse given name found in Geirr Bassi, p. 10

Jónsdóttir is a patronymic byname from *Jón*, found in Geirr Bassi, p. 12, using the byname construction rules found in Geirr Bassi, p. 17

Device coloration and layout required a redraw. This was done with the submitter's approval.

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Hvitr Loðinbak (Nordwache) - **New Name & New Device.** *Ermine, two lynxes rampant addorsed guardant gules*

Submitter desires a masculine name.

No major changes.

Meaning (White\Blonde) most important.

Hvitr is a Norse given name found in Geirr Bassi, p.12, meaning "white"

Loðinn is a Norse descriptive byname found in Geirr Bassi, p.25, meaning "hairy"

Bak is a Norse descriptive byname meaning "back"

(<http://www.vikinganswerlady.com/ONMensNames.shtml#b> originally found in FJ = Fellows-Jensen, Gillian. Scandinavian Personal Names in Lincolnshire and Yorkshire. Copenhagen. Akademisk Forlag. 1968.)

Precedent allows double descriptive bynames in Old Norse, provided they can apply to the same person, which these do. Noting that Geir Bassi contains two descriptive bynames with *loðin* with one N, *loðinhoði* (Shaggy-head) and *loðinkinni* (Shaggy-cheeked), we believe that the compound **Loðinbak** is a reasonable construction.

Ingríðr Viðarsdóttir (Wintermist) - New Device Change. *Quarterly Or and vert, in bend two owls gules.*

Old Item: *Vert, in bend two dogwood blossoms argent seeded Or and a bordure argent, to be retained as a badge.*

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Isela of Silvercreek (Wintermist) - New Name & New Device. *Lozengy purple and Or, a brown rabbit proper rampant contourney and a rabbit rampant argent*

Submitter desires a feminine name.

No major changes.

Sound (Is - Sell - Uh) most important.

Isela is the submitter's legal given name as seen on her CA drivers' license and school ID and attested to by James *Furison* and Manus *Battlement*.

Silvercreek is a constructed English place name, using the pattern of "Silver + topographic feature."

Silverside is listed in Bardsley's Dictionary of English and Scottish Surnames, p. 691. *Silverdale* (meaning "silver valley" dated 1320), *Silverstone* (meaning "silver village" dated 1260), and *Silverton* (meaning "silver ford" dated 1249) are all listed in Watts, p. 551.

"Creke," meaning "a small stream or brook" and used in a place name, is found in 1438: "Creke hire," as attested by the Middle English Dictionary, s.n. **CRIKE**, 1.(b), and is cited from *The Place-Names of Cambridgeshire and the isle of Ely*, Ed. P.H. Reaney, EPN Soc. 19 (1943), p. 254.

The more familiar spelling of creek is found in the OED, pp. 1158, and dated to 1592: "As Streams, with which their winding banks do play, Stopp'd by their Creeks, run softly thro' the Plain."

We believe that this allows the construction of *Silvercreek* as an English placename.

Device returned for redraw.

Ivan Kovachevich (Dun Or) - New Name & New Device. *Per pale azure and sable, a cross formy voided and interlaced argent*

Submitter desires a masculine name.

No major changes.

Ivan is a Russian masculine given name found in Dictionary of Period Russian Names, 3rd Edition, Wickenden, pp. 120-121, S.N, Ioann - Ivan in this spelling is dated to 1181.

Kovachevich is a Russian patronymic byname found in the same source, p. 165, dated to 1455.

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Ívarr Sigurðarson (Dreiburgen) – Laurel Resub Household Name. *Radenach Hous*

Language (Old English) most important.

Culture (Old English) most important.

Meaning (Red Oak) most important.

The submitter's previous household name *Radenach Sveit* was returned by Laurel on the March 2015 LoAR for combining a Middle English substantive element with a Norse designator.

Appearing on the form as *Radnache Haus*, we have changed the spelling to match the documentation.

Radenach is an English placename found in Ekwall dated 1200, s.n. Radenage, from the Old English "reade ac", dative form "readan ac" meaning "red oak."

Hous is the Middle English word for "house, dwelling" found in the Middle English Dictionary (<http://quod.lib.umich.edu/cgi/m/mec/med-idx?type=id&id=MED21360>)

This follows the pattern of "placename + building" for English household names.

Household name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Jóra Flókadóttir (Naevehjem) - New Name Change.

Old Item: Jóra Kvistsdóttir, to be released.

Submitter desires a feminine name.

No major changes.

Sound most important.

Jóra is a feminine Norse given name found in Geirr Bassi, p. 12.

Flóki is found as a male Norse given name in Geirr Bassi, page 9. Per rules found in Geirr Bassi, page 17, the terminal *i* becomes an *a* in the genitive to form **Flókadóttir**.

Name change approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Jóra Flókadóttir (Naevehjem) - New Badge. *Azure, a falcon striking contourney, maintaining a sword bendwise sinister argent.*

The submitter, *Jóra Kvistsdóttir*, is submitting a primary name change to *Jóra Flókadóttir* in this LoI. The name on the form is a registered alternate name of the submitter. The form also notes this submission is to be associated with the household name *Striking Falcon*. That household name is not registered, and so the badge cannot be associated with it.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Kasha Ivanov syn (Starkhafn) - New Name & New Device. *Gules, in fess two winged fish haurient, wings addorsed, argent*

Submitter desires a masculine name.

No major changes.

Kasha is a masculine Russian given name found in Wickenden 3rd edition, page 133, meaning "porridge", dated to 1495.

Ivanov syn is a patronymic formed from Ivanov, found in Wickenden, 3rd edition, p.120, under Ioann, dated to before 1147. In that source's Masculine Patronymics section, it notes that it was common to add the word *syn* (son) to the patronymic or to the "unaltered" form of the father's given name. Usually the word *syn* was placed after the patronymic (e.g., Gridia Timofeev syn Batutin [1538] [Tup]) but it could also precede the patronymic.

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Kasha Ivanov syn (Starkhafn) - New Badge (*Fieldless*) *A winged fish haurient argent.*

This badge is not in conflict with Christopher Troweselagh: (*Fieldless*) *A winged fish volant bendwise embowed argent* (December 1995)

Badge approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Katherene de la Huerta (Nordwache) - New Name & New Device. *Argent, three scorpions gules*

Submitter desires a feminine name and accepts minor but not major changes.

Spelling (Katherene) most important.

Katherene is the submitter's legal given name found on her CA drivers' license and attested to by *Illuminada Chanson* and Manus *Battlement*.

de la Huerta is found in family search M86203-2, *Alonso de la Huerta* (<https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:FFJL-8JC>) dated to 1589 and in Spanish Names from Late 15th Century at <http://www.sca.org/heraldry/laurel/names/Isabella>.

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Kendrick Peste (Dreiburgen) - New Device. *Or, an eagle sable on a chief azure three fleurs de lis argent.*

This conflicts with Alicia FitzHugh of Ravensworth (registered January 2001, via An Tir): *Or, a raven displayed sable and on a chief azure three wolves passant argent.* There is only one DC for change in type of the tertiary charges.

Per the LoAR cover letter, dated 12/31/2012: We have long held that the use of any bird other than an eagle in the displayed posture is a step from period practice. The January 2000 Cover Letter stated that "with vanishingly rare exceptions the eagle is the only bird found displayed in period heraldry. Therefore any other bird displayed will arguably be visually similar to an eagle..." This visual similarity affects how much difference we can grant when considering conflict between a non-eagle displayed and an eagle displayed. In the case of a raven displayed, a fairly popular charge lately, versus an eagle displayed, there is neither a substantial nor a distinct change.

Device returned for conflict.

Kiena the Blue (Dreiburgen) - New Name Change.

Old Item: Keina le Bleu, to be released.

Submitter desires a feminine name.

No changes.

Kiena is a feminine English given name found in Talan Gwynek's "Feminine Given Names in a Dictionary of English Surnames", dated to this spelling to 1180 (<http://heraldry.sca.org/names/reaneyHZ.html>).

the Blue is the Lingua Anglica form of the descriptive byname *le Bleu* found in Bardsley, s.n. Bleu

Name change approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Krestii Ivanovna (Starkhafn) - New Badge. (*Fieldless*) *A dragon's head erased sable*

Against the badge of Aladar Stensen (reg. Nov 2011 via An Tir), (*Fieldless*) *A dragon's head erased sable gorged of a pearlled coronet argent*, there's a DC for fieldlessness and a DC for the coronet, which in this case is equivalent to a tertiary charge.

A similar count brings it clear of Drachenwald's badge for the Sigillum Regis of Drachenwald (reg. Jan 2014), (*Fieldless*) *A dragon's head couped sable charged with the letters SC conjoined Or*.

Badge approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Kyra of Thera (Calafia) – Kingdom Resub Name & Kingdom Resub Device. *Per bend sinister gules and sable, a chalice and in chief a key fesswise reversed argent.*

The submitter claims that her original submission of a similar sounding name and identical device were made sometime in 2014 and subsequently lost. Although we have been unable to locate any record of this, we have given the submitter the benefit of the doubt.

Cyra is documented as a feminine given name in 1647 <https://books.google.com/books?id=GnpjAAAaCAAJ&pg=PA520>. The registration of William Korwynson of Starfall (June 2015, West) notes the initial C/K switch is common in English.

Thera is an island in the Aegean Sea known by that name since ancient times.

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Livia Silvana (Wintermist) - New Name & New Device. *Per bend azure and argent, a cross gurgitee argent and three mullets purpure*

Submitter desires a feminine name.

No major changes.

All name elements and construction are taken from "A Simple Guide to Imperial Roman Names" by Ursula Georges, at <http://heraldry.sca.org/names/roman.html>

Livia is a feminine Roman nomen.

Silvana is a feminine Roman cognomen.

The use of the cross gurgity is a SFPP [Alfarr Utherson, LoAR of April 2011].

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Lúta Gjallandisdóttir (Angels) - New Name & New Device. *Purple, a crescent pendant argent between a pair of stag's attires Or*

Submitted as *Lúta Gjallandisdottir*, we have added the accent on the byname to comply with the requirements for consistently using (or dropping) accents.

Lúta is a feminine Norse given name found in Geirr Bassi, page 13

Gjallandisdóttir is a patronymic formed from Gjallandi, a male Norse given name found in Geirr Bassi, page 10.

Name approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Device approved and forwarded to Laurel.

Lyle Magnusson (Wintermist) - New Name.

Lyle is an English surname found in FamilySearch Historical Records including:

William Lyle, christened 13 Nov 1603, Kent, England, Batch P00851-1

"Creke," meaning "a small stream or brook" and used in a place name, is found in 1438: "Creke hire," as attested by the Middle English Dictionary, s.n. CRIKE, 1.(b), and is cited from The Place-Names of Cambridgeshire and the isle of Ely, Ed. P.H. Reaney, EPN Soc. 19 (1943), p. 254.

Heralds note "fantastic canting arms!"

There is a possible conflict with Alesia de Maris of Ravenstar, *Per pale sable and Or, two ravens respectant counterchanged.* (8/2011). One DC for orientation (respectant vs. addorsed) and we believe there's a DC between ravens (normal-shaped birds) and owls (raptor-shaped birds).

Oikos (οἶκος) was used in the Greek version of the Bible to translate both “a house or dwelling” and “a lineage” (<https://billmounce.com/greek-dictionary/oikos>)

Ataraxia (ἀταραξία, "tranquility") is a Greek term used by Pyrrho and Epicurus for a lucid state of robust tranquility, characterized by ongoing freedom from distress and worry.

A silphium pod is from the silphium plant, known to Egyptians and Romans, which was such an essential part of the economy for the North African city of Syrene that most of their currency featured the plant, or its pod.
